**Summary:** I am the author of the [Space and Cyber Affairs Simulation](#), which has been developed at IE University through the Multimedia Department. The game uses challenges in the space and cyber realms to teach students important insights from game theory and social constructivism. This simulation is used in courses on a wide range of topics, including international relations, game theory, negotiation, strategy, and sustainability. The game materials include a detailed teaching note for instructors, optional lecture slides that can be presented before the game, and a short preliminary reading for students that will give them the necessary background information to understand and play the game.
